# Curriculum Letter

## **Year 2—Under the Sea**

#### The Big Picture

End GOAL: To create an Aquarium. Audience: Our Parents As writers, we will be learning 'The Snail and the Whale' before writing our own version of the story. The children will be focusing on constructing a sentence with correct sentence punctuation. Then the children will choose a sea creature to write an information text about. After the half-term, the children will be researching the Great Fire of London and will write a recount of the main events. Towards the Christmas period the children will be asked to make a Christmas decoration and write instructions for others to follow.

As Mathematicians, we will be looking closely at the place value of 2-digit numbers. We will look at a group of numbers ordering them and comparing the using <, > and =. We will use apparatus and images to support us as we build this secure understanding of place value. We will be securing our recall of number bonds to any number up to 20 (e.g. 4+8=12) alongside counting up in steps of 2, 3, 5 and 10. We will also be looking at shapes and their properties.

As readers, we will share a range of different recounts and information texts. We will support the children to use their phonic knowledge to support their reading and also use questioning to check their understanding. This year we will be promoting a range of vocabulary through a range of opportunities.

As musicians, we will learn to play a four whole ocarina. Through this we will look at notation, keeping a steady pulse and playing rhythms. Alongside this we will learn songs to support our learning across the curriculum such as 'The Five Ocean Hip Hop'. We will also be listening and appraising pieces of music from the BBC Ten Pieces. You can have a look at it here—https://www.bbc.com/teach/ten-pieces.

As gymnasts, we will develop gymnastic sequences of movement using floor space and apparatus. After half term we will focus on the dance elements of Leap into Life and we hope to link this to the KS1 Christmas Nativity.

As sports people in outdoor PE, we will focus on invasion game skills and throwing and catching skills.

In GOAL the children will do the following:

As Scientists, we will learn about animals that live in the sea. We will look at how these animals are adapted for the habitat. We will also learn about the life cycle of these animals. We will also explore the terms living, non-living and dead.

As designers, we will design and make a shoe box aquarium. We will look at joining materials in different ways, thinking of ideas and planning what to do next (reasoning and justifying choices) and describe designs by using pictures, diagrams, models and words.

As artists, we develop our sketching skills with a focus on drawing animals from under the sea.

As explorers, we will learning map skills. We will learn about the continents and oceans of the world, locating them on a globe. We will look at where we fit are in the world zooming down from our planet, our continent, our country, our village/town/city, our street all the way to our house.

As computer experts, we will learn to log-in and out of the Chromebooks independently, use the internet bookmarks to go to websites chosen by the teachers and navigate these websites such as Purple Mash. They will also develop their speed of typing common words such as their name and high frequency words.
