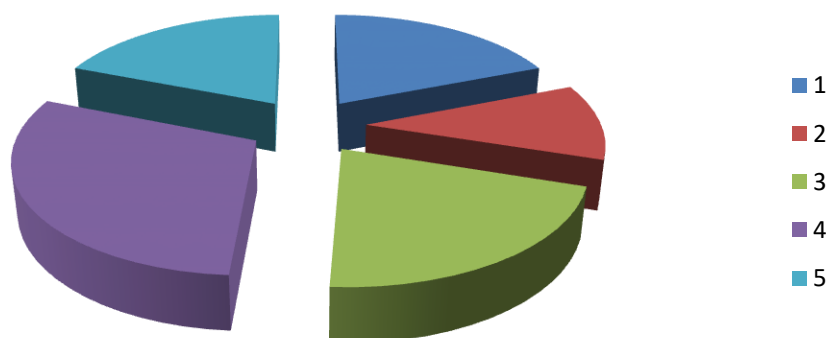

Outcomes to Date:

Key indicator 1: The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity

- Active Playtimes with the help of our PE Learning Team (PELT) who organise, run and feedback on the effectiveness of Active Playtimes.
- Intra-school competitive sports competitions increasing engagement and motivation
- Participation in Dartmoor School Sport Partnership (DSSP) – we are on course for 100% of the children in school to have attended at least one event throughout the year.
- Celebration Days – Sports Days, Rainbow days, increasing involvement in activity across the school.
- Greater range of Clubs increasing engagement – staff or specialist coaches running PE and sport clubs- Tag Rugby, Football, Rugby, Cricket, Forest School, Mindfulness, archery, gymnastics, dance
- Intervention through the FunFit programme for those in KS1/Reception who need support in developing their gross motor skills. If no progress is seen then the children will be referred to Vbranch House.
- Target of Pupil Premium children for active engagement in clubs on offer – priority for places therefore more active
- Supporting of transport to these events for increased engagement

Key indicator 2: The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement

- PELT assisting in reporting on events through the school's blog and other social media sites.
- PELT supporting school staff in assemblies to promote Active Playtimes.
- PELT developing our Outside of School Sport board which shows the achievement of children at local clubs and sports facilities.
- Linking PE and school sport to our School Development Plan – using the blog to improve the level of writing in school by narrowing the gap between boys and girls.

- CPD for staff who can then deliver more engaging lessons and clubs.
- School clubs – greater variety of sports clubs on offer to a greater age range.
- Inspire day – athlete attending school to talk about their journey through sport and need for motivation and determination.
- Young play leaders training and networking has shared best practice

Key indicator 3: Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport

- Support from specialist coaches and advisors on lesson planning, engagement, differentiation, inclusion and progress of pupils in single lessons.
- CPD – offering staff the opportunity to develop their PE and sport expertise which will benefit those they're teaching.

Key indicator 4: Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

- Active Playtimes with the help of our PE Learning Team (PELT) who organise, run and feedback on the effectiveness of Active Playtimes.
- Participation in Dartmoor School Sport Partnership (DSSP) – we are on course for 100% of the children in school to have attended at least one event throughout the year (tag rugby, High 5 netball, Change4Life, handball, cricket, swimming, cross country, badminton, boys futsal, aquasplash, Year 4 gymnastics, Year 1 Dance sharing festival, Year 3 Dartmoor3Ball Festival and gymnastic tournaments)
- Celebration Days –Sports Days, Comic Relief.

Clubs – staff or specialist coaches running PE and sport clubs – Tag Rugby, Football, Rugby, Cricket, Forest School, Mindfulness, archery, gymnastics, dance

Key indicator 5: Increased participation in competitive sport

- Participation in Dartmoor School Sport Partnership (DSSP) – we are on course for 100% of the children in school to have attended at least one event throughout the year
- Participation with local feeder schools in competitions

Swimming
