School Equality, Diversity, Inclusion focus: in our weekly key stage assemblies (Years 3-6 on a Tuesday and Years 1-2 on a Thursday) we are focusing on another protected characteristic. Last half term our focus was gender; gender equality, gender inequality and breaking down stereotypes. This half term our focus is on disabilities. We have discussed ability, disability, visible and invisible. In KS1 we have looked at the book 'Wonder' initially to think about visible disabilities and in KS2 we have been talking about hearing impairment. Mrs Parker was a special guest at the hearing impairment assembly for KS2 where she talked about how a rare illness had resulted in a hearing impairment for her and how, after support, she has turned that disability into new abilities ie. Lip reading and a new found confidence. KS2 explored some key signs that we would like to learn in our school and how sign language can support those who have a hearing impairment and also how it is a useful tool in different situations for everyone. Sign language is being introduced as a new GCSE this year and this was also discussed.

Both KS1 and KS2 will be exploring invisible disabilities later this half term, introducing the language of neurodiverse and neurotypical. We will be looking at stories within KS1 and also famous people in both KS1 and KS2 who talk about their neurodiversity. More information will be in future newsletters about this.
