**Family Learning Conferences:** Family Learning Conferences (FLC) will be taking place on Thursday 14 March and Monday 18 March 2024. This will be an opportunity to hear about your child's learning and next steps in their learning. Teachers who work on a Monday will be attending the Monday FLC and the teachers who work on a Thursday will attend the Thursday FLC. You have been sent an email with links to book either an online or face to face appointment. These links are class specific so please take care to book the right child in with the right teacher.

**Medications in school**: From this week we will be sending email notifications to parents whenever children have medicine in school. This will provide confirmation that your child has been given any prescribed medicines that you've asked us to administer and also let you know if they've had any pain relief like Calpol or Ibuprofen so you can adjust dosage timings at home if necessary. Medicine should always be handed in and collected by a responsible adult and we always need a completed Medicines Form to be able to give children any medicines or inhalers.
