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
Family Learning Conferences: Family Learning Conferences (FLC) will be taking place on Thursday 10 October and Monday 21 October 2024. This will be an opportunity to hear about your child's learning and next steps in their learning. Teachers who work on a Monday will be attending the Monday FLC and the teachers who work on a Thursday will attend the Thursday FLC. Next week we will email out booking letters with further details and timings and links to book an appointment with your child's teacher.

School Census Day- Census Day will take place next Thursday, 3 Oct. This is an important day for the school. On this day, data is collected from the school which is used to calculate some of our funding for the next financial year. As well as recording the number of children on roll it also records our uptake of Free School Meals (FSM) and Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) on that particular day. This then informs our funding to run the kitchen for the next year. We do not make any money from the kitchen and school does need to use other funds in order to run it however we do get some grant funding that supports this.

It is for this reason that we are asking for your support to ensure that we maximise meal numbers on that day. As far as possible, we would like every child who is entitled to a Free School Meal or a Universal Infant Free School Meal (all Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children) to have a school lunch. If they normally have a packed lunch and would like to try a dinner on this day, they can do this and still bring in their packed lunch in case they do not like it.

Lost Property: Please remember to label your child's clothes, snack/lunch boxes and drinks bottles. We are already accumulating a large amount of unnamed items in our lost property. There is a box outside the office if you'd like to take a look. Thank you
