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Mental Health and Personal Development Update: Civic Awards We are very proud of our year six children who are working hard to achieve their Civic Award. The Torbay Civic Award was created by a deep belief that education should be broader and more futures-driven and that we, as leaders in education, have a moral responsibility to develop children's attitudes and values as well as transferable skills to equip them for a future none of us can yet imagine.
