Our children embraced the spirit of World Book Day with a variety of engaging activities designed to ignite their passion for reading:

- **Reception:** Our youngest learners shared the joy of reading with their Year 6 "Rainbow Buddies," fostering cross-school connections. They also explored the vibrant world of "Elmer" by using adjectives to design Elmer-inspired cats and discussed the importance of celebrating differences.
- Year 1: Creativity took centre stage as children created story backgrounds for their costumed selves, shared favourite books, and danced to the energetic MC Grammar World Book Day song.
- Year 2: A dazzling World Book Day catwalk showcased imaginative costumes, followed by bookmark crafting and dedicated reading time.
- Year 3: Collaborative reading and a thrilling World Book Day quiz on Blooket challenged and entertained our children.
- Year 4: Children participated in the World Book Day live lesson, enjoyed "drop everything and read" moments, listened to author recommendations, and designed bookmarks.
- Year 5: A unique "Footy and Booky" quiz, featuring questions read by Premier League and Women's Super League players, captivated our sports and book enthusiasts. They also enjoyed reading outdoors in the sunshine.
- Year 6: Our oldest children shared books with Reception, tackled World Book Day maths activities, and participated in a reading quiz.
- Lunchtime Reading Takeover: The "On Cloud Nine" zone transformed into a literary haven, where children enjoyed reading in the sunshine or listening to Mr. Moore (aka Miss Trunchbull) read captivating stories.



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We would also like to thank all the families for their incredible efforts in creating such fabulous and varied costumes. The children looked amazing, and your creativity truly brought the characters to life!



The day was a resounding success, filled with laughter, learning, and the magic of storytelling.
